What does the fund invest in?

The fund invests primarily in a mix of fixed income securities, preferred shares, mortgages and dividend paying North American equities to provide a tax efficient source of monthly income. Up to 25% of the assets of the fund may be invested in foreign securities. The charts below give you a snapshot of the fund's investments on March 31, 2016. The fund's investments will change.

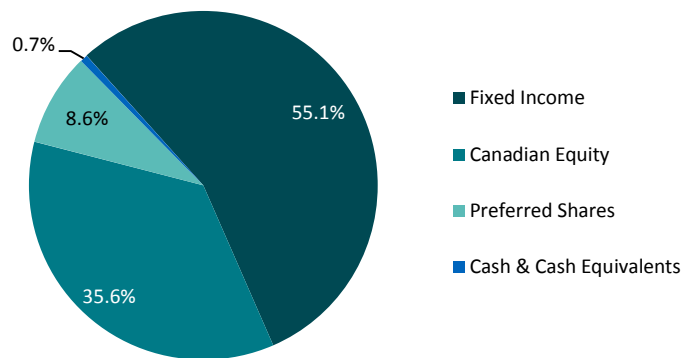

How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk Rating

Leith Wheeler has rated the volatility of this fund as **Low-to-Medium**.

This rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

No guarantees

Like most mutual funds, this fund does not have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

How has the fund performed?

This section tells you how the Series F units of the fund have performed since inception. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund's returns.

Who is this fund for?

Investors who:

- are looking for a medium to long-term investment
- want regular monthly cash flow with the potential for capital gains
- can handle the ups and downs of the stock market

 Do not buy this fund if you are not willing to accept some fluctuation in the value of your investment.

A word about tax

In general, you will have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you take them in cash, or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series F units of the fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

Sales charges

There are no sales charges for Series F units of the Fund.

More about the trailing commission

Leith Wheeler does not pay dealers trailing commissions for the distribution of the fund.

Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns.

As of December 31, 2015, the fund's expenses were 0.78% of its value. This equals \$7.80 for every \$1,000 invested. Leith Wheeler waived some of the fund's expenses. If it had not done so, the MER would have been higher.

Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
Representative's Firm Fees	You must participate in a fee-based arrangement with your representative's firm in order to be eligible to purchase the Series F units of the Fund. The amount of the fee is determined between you and the firm.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund units within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, fund facts or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
